**Starting at 10 am we will sail in the lagoon on a historic sailing and motor boat, which the painter Giuseppe Zigaina shared with his friend Pasolini, using it as a place of inspiration for his works, family and convivial space for artists and intellectuals, a backstage for some films, an alcove for the film Medea with Maria Callas.**

If you want to know about the history of Venice and how it was born you cannot fail to visit the place from which it all started, Torcello, we will sail towards the canals, we will enjoy the landscape of salt marshes where stubborn herbs grow that do not fear salt like glasswort and minutina, secret ingredients used by the ancient kitchens of the territory. We will pass among scales and we will learn about the most common fishing techniques in the Venetian lagoon practiced by our friend Domenico Rossi of the fishermen's cooperative.

We will have lunch and savor the local cuisine.

We will visit the histrionic Paolo Andrich and his house Museum, a place and, in the past, home to the multifaceted Lucio Andrich, the house museum is not a place suitable for everyone because it requires precious time linked to listening. Torcello, like all of Venice is made of oral stories, stories of loves that are intertwined like that of Uncle Andrich and his wife Clementina, it is an island of lovers and passions where the lanterns outside the doors were signs for unconventional loves.

Torcello, like the other well-known islands of Venice, is beautiful when it is emptied of mass tourism, when you can enjoy the silence and the real atmosphere that has always *inhabited it*.
